DARE TO TAKE TO THE STREETS

Challenge yourself to walk* to work for a week. For those with a 20-mile commute, how about getting off the train a stop early or parking the car / bike a little further away from the office? If you have a young family, how about walking to school one morning?

Whatever you do, get sponsored to do it so you can make your miles matter. Set up a page on **JustGiving**, aim for a target of £100 and let all your friends know what you are doing. Update them when you set off on your walk(s), take some snaps on the way, and share your feelings about the difference you are making.

You could also arrange a team walk at lunchtime if that works better for your workplace. Don't forget to ask if your boss might match your fundraising.

TOP TIPS FOR YOUR JUSTGIVING PAGE

Customise your page: add a photo, explain your challenge, and show why this is important to you.

> Set your fundraising target: let people know how much you're aiming for and what the money will do.

3 **Sponsor yourself!** Set the bar for everyone else, show your commitment to your challenge and your passion for the DEC.

Tell everyone you know: use social, email and messenger apps to share your page link with anyone and everyone you know! Ask them to support you and let them know what a donation of just £30 will do.

Thank and update your supporters: post messages of thanks into social and add training or preparation updates on your fundraising page.

Send reminders: everyone is busy, so don't forget to politely chase up those who may have said they would donate but haven't had time to do it yet. This is often best done at the very start of the month, not long after payday.

FUNDRAISER'S BRIEF THE INDONESIA TSUNAMI



What happened

On Friday 28 September, an earthquake measuring 7.4 on the Richter scale rocked the Indonesian island of Sulawesi. This triggered a tsunami with waves as high as 18 feet which hit Palu, Donggala and Mamuju at speeds of 400 miles per hour, leaving a trail of destruction in its wake.

Who's been affected and how?

- Tens of thousands of homes have been destroyed
- 5,000 are missing At least 2,000 people have died and more than
- A further 10,700 people are seriously injured
- Around 200,000 survivors are in urgent need of humanitarian assistance, a quarter of whom are children
- Whole areas were cut off for days and as rescuers struggle to reach outlying communities, authorities fear that casualties will continue to rise. It is estimated that it could sadly take up to five months to find all of the dead
- Landslides, debris, a shortage of fuel plus power-outages have hampered emergency relief efforts

What's needed?

- Food people have gone for days with very limited, if any, food
- Clean water drinking water is in very short supply, as water sources have become contaminated and water pipes have been damaged
- First aid some hospitals have been destroyed, while those that are still functioning are overwhelmed. The risk of disease outbreaks is high because water and waste systems are broken
- Shelter more than 67,000 houses have reportedly been damaged. Many homes sank down into the mud open when the earthquake caused the soil to liquefy. People are staying in makeshift shelters or in the due to fear of further damage from aftershocks or more earthquakes
- Trauma-counselling to help survivors cope with everything that's happened to them

October is the start of the rainy season which will most likely affect relief efforts, making the need for a swift response and added shelter all the more urgent.

What have we provided so far?

From the moment disaster struck, DEC members have been providing Indonesian partners with vital support to scale up rapidly and save lives. Through those partners, we've delivered essential items such as: food packages; thousands of litres of clean water; medicines and hygiene kits; tents and tarpaulins; emergency separated families, and created child-friendly spaces where children can play and recover while their families vehicles such as ambulances and water trucks; and generators, fuel and lighting equipment. We've also supported the set-up of temporary medical clinics and public kitchens, helped with the reunification of begin the process of rebuilding their lives.

Where your money will go

- £10 could provide a survivor with clean water for 2 months
- £90 could provide emergency shelter for 3 families
- £150 could feed 3 families for a month
